SHORTMAT COMPETITIONS:

As we turn to a new year of fun and frolic we start the short mat competitions. This year we intend to be a little more serious as we are incorporating a formal short mat winner's presentation at the Annual Bowling Club Dinner. Please look at the noticeboard where you will find the competition sheets.

Please add your name to the appropriate sheet to enter. There are 4 sheets one for each type of competition. There will be singles, doubles, triples and fours competitions.

As last year there will be no entry fee, but you must pay the normal short mat amount each time you play apart from the finals.

All competitions will be based on the winner being the one with the most points. The number of ends/games should hopefully take a similar amount of time. Singles to play 15 ends with 4 woods, doubles and triples to play 10 ends (3 woods for doubles and 2 woods for triples). Fours to play with 2 woods for 8 ends. In the case of a draw an extra end will be played until there is a winner. Normal short mat rules apply.

It is intended that the competitions do not interfere with normal play and that games will normally be played as and when contestants are available to play without interfering with existing daily arrangements, or with the Bridge Club on Tuesday and Friday nights.

Singles could involve a lot of walking, so people may want to organise a volunteer assistant to stand at the other end to act as umpire.

Note that for heating purposes you will need to notify David Mowlem as to when you have agreed to play if it is outside normal heating times.

There has been a request from people that normally play together to be able to choose someone from their group to play with. If you would like to do this then enter the names on the sheet with a team name.

Membership Renewals

Membership for all of us renews on the 1st April and new renewal forms will be distributed by email in early February. At our AGM, Lawn Bowls Membership for 2019 was set at £60. This should be paid, please, prior to the 31st March. Payment can be made by cheque, cash or Bank Transfer. Every Member will need to fill in the revised Membership Application Form so that the Club can comply with the General Data Protection Regulations introduced into Law in 2018. You will shortly receive the Club's Privacy Statement which defines the data that we can store about you. The new form will include a section where you give your consent to the Club holding and using your data in line with the Privacy Statement. In practical terms nothing will change other than that there will be an even stronger focus on data security within the Club. The Club also needs your consent to allow other members to access your phone number. You may withhold consent but that will probably prevent you from playing in both internal and external competitions. Once again there will be no major change to the way in which we operate.

We have been successful in recent years in growing the membership of the Club to a level that allows us to maintain our Green and Clubhouse to a high standard. Each year we have a few members who do not renew and 2019 will be no exception. Once again we have to focus on attracting newcomers to at least stabilise our numbers. The past two year's Free Membership for new recruits was successful but the Committee feels that for the upcoming year we can offer a Half Price deal and still be attractive. New Members, those who have not played at Malvern Priory Bowling Club before, will pay £30 for their first full year. Members joining from May onwards will pay pro rata of that amount with a minimum Fee of £10. One taster session will be free but new members will then pay the usual roll-up and match fees.

As you renew your membership please think about friends or colleagues who might like to come along and try the wonderful game of Bowls. If just one in four of us could recruit a new member, we would secure our numbers for another year.

The Green/Maintenance

'Happy New Year everyone' The new equipment store door has now been fitted, I am sure you will agree its a great improvement. The key to the new lock is hanging in the usual place.

The schedule for the next season is for a big maintenance and clear out week starting on Tuesday 2nd April. Volunteers will be required to back up the cutting of the green in the event of our new grass mowing contractor not being available. Tuition to operate the mower will be held on Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd April at 10 am.

Volunteers will be needed to clear the whole area which will include clearing vegetation, cutting the edges of the green, repairing and cleaning the ditches, weeding, scraping debris of all the glass windows and reputtying and painting where necessary. The shed will also need to be inspected for winter damage and repaired where necessary, it also needs to be reorganised and cleaned. All drains and gutters need to be cleaned out. New guttering needs to be fitted at the south east end of the clubhouse.

The biggest job is the relaying out of the green and I shall be looking for volunteers who can spend a day or two doing this.

Maintenance continues on Mondays and it is disappointing to see so few volunteers each week when we have such an enthusiastic bunch of players.

Like Housekeeping it is the same faithful few who do all the work each week. Come on guys all members both inside and out players come and give me a hand. Much of the maintenance is done for the enjoyment of those using the clubhouse during the winter months. All tools you will need are in the store room with the new door.

Access to the shed is restricted to comply with Health and Safety.

Progress on the new front door is proceeding slowly!

Lawn Bowls Semaphore Signaling (Proposal)

LET YOUR HANDS LARGELY DO THE TALKING – on the bowling Green!

“Don’t Shout – Don’t Yell”

- Signs or signals are used to communicate silently between players at different ends of the rink.
- Skips should review the signals that are used during the game with their players prior to the game.
- Opposing players are permitted to ask for clarification of signals if they are unclear.
 1. Voices cannot generally be heard over background sounds.
 2. Shouting disturbs players on the rinks.
 3. Your team will feel more in sync if you can read each other’s signals.
 4. Signals help communication and the flow of the game.
 5. Signalling minimises drawing attention of your opponents to certain situations.

RULE 1: ONLY communicate with your team when you have possession of the mat.

RULE 2: Give information (especially Vice) ONLY when asked for.

- **MAT ALIGNMENT**

- When a mat needs to be shifted in a given direction, skip stands with hands set apart by ~ 30cm at shoulder height, and then they are moved in unison in the desired direction.

- **SETTING THE JACK**

- **WE HAVE THE JACK!**

- Left arm by your side and right hand placed on left shoulder

- **THEY HAVE THE JACK!**

- Left Arm by your side and right arm moved down from 45 degrees to side.

- **DELIVERING JACK**

- Skip stands at the desired location for the Jack when the lead delivers it.

- **ALIGNING THE JACK**

- Lead uses both hands at shoulder level to show distance Jack has to be moved (Left or Right) to the center axis of the rink. Bring hands together below chin when Jack is in correct position.

- **DESCRIBING BUILD-UP OF HEAD**

- **CALL FOR A DRAW DELIVERY**

- Bowl on the Forehand

- Extend your left arm to the side (if bowler is right handed).

- Bowl on the Backhand

- Extend your right arm to the side (if bowler is right handed).

- Bowl either way

- Extend arms to both sides.

- **WHERE IS JACK?**

- Bend down, and hold your palm forward whilst pointing to the jack.

- **JACK HIGH**

- When last bowl comes to rest the same distance as the Jack, skip/vice waggles arm from side to side in a pendulum motion.

- **BOWL IS RUNNING TOO FAST**

- Rotate your hands together.

- **LESS WEIGHT REQUIRED**

- Skip/Vice makes a pushing down motion with their hands from the waist.

- **MORE WEIGHT REQUIRED**

- Skip/Vice raises hands above their heads as if to show arm muscles, indicating to player that a greater delivery weight is needed.

- **IDENTIFYING A BOWL**

- Our Bowl

- Point closely to the bowl and tap your shoulder or chest.

- Their Bowl

- Point closely to the bowl and wave your arm away.

- Shot Bowl

- To indicate the bowl that is closest to the Jack (current shot), skip/vice point to the bowl.

- **GIVE WARNING – WATCH THE HEAD'**

- Before delivering a "runner/drive," simulate a fast delivery with your bowling arm.

- **HAVE YOUR BOWL STOP HERE**

- Put your foot where you want the bowl to finish and point to it.

- **BOWLS ARE TOUCHING**

- Touch knuckles together.

- **SHOT FOR US**

- Point at bowl and Tap your shoulder or head.

- **SHOT AGAINST US**

- Point at bowl and Tap your leg.

- **BOWL IN FRONT OR BEHIND THE JACK**

- Short Distance - spread your hands one above the other showing distance from Jack. (NOTE: Always give the DEPTH distance, not WIDTH.)

- Long Distance – position hand above ground to indicate distance.

- **THE SHOT IS A MEASURE**

- Wave hands apart, together, and then apart as if measuring.

- **ARE WE 'AHEAD' OR 'DOWN'?**

- Left arm by your side, Right arm points 'Upwards' if ahead, or 'Downwards' if behind.

- **TEAM SCORE (VICE CONFIRMS)**

- AHEAD – Right hand taps left shoulder the score number achieved for the end.

- BEHIND – Right hand taps right leg the score lost for the end.

- **CHALK MY TOUCHER**

- Cross your hands at your wrist and hold them in front of you.

- **WELL DONE**

- Skip/Vice - raises 'Thumbs up' or by 'Clapping'.

- **OUT OF BOUNDS**

- Skip/Vice scan down Rink boundaries beyond the rink boundary marker to establish whether a delivered 'Bowl' or 'Jack' is declared in or out of play. Arm pointing inward to rink declare 'IN', pointing outwards declares 'OUT'.

- **DEAD END**

- If Jack is knocked out beyond the side boundaries of the rink, the end is determined to be dead and has to be replayed. Those managing the head hold their hands in front of them with palms down and make a scissor-motion by waving the arms back and forth signifying that the end has been wiped out. (The above Signals are provisional – others are possible, particularly when bowler asks details about the head. Comment and input welcomed!)
