## GOOD NEWS for 2020 - Automatic Watering system on its way!

At a meeting of Committee members held on Friday 6th December 2019 it was agreed to go ahead with the purchase and installation of an automatic irrigation system. The club has been successful in receiving grants of £3,100 towards the cost. With a contribution from club funds and a loan the committee feels confident we should go ahead. It is thanks to all members who have helped raise funds that we are now able to go ahead with this ambitious project.

An application has been made for monies which will enable the club to ensure the system is installed (weather permitting) prior to the start of the 2020 season.

There will obviously be some interruptions and inconvenience whilst the work is being carried out and we hope all members will understand. The benefits of such a system will be huge for the club.

In my absence Normal Hall will Project Manage the installation with David Irvine as Chief Engineer with assistance from Roy Barber and Terry Bartlett. These four people know the design and precise requirements and have been fully involved in the final design.

These date may well move due to adverse weather. A lot of the installation equipment and tooling will have to be stored in the clubhouse and there will be many people working on the green during the entire period. The contractor and members of the club working on the installation will need access to the club so we hope all short mat members will understand during this period.

This is a huge step forward and commitment for the club that a few years ago was struggling to find enough players to participate in friendly matches with other clubs.

To save money much of the work will be done by club members, if you are able to help in any way please contact Normal Hall - this could even be making tea/coffee for the workers. Any queries must be made to Norman not to the contractors or individuals working on the green.

The club's future is looking extremely healthy. Back in the late 1980's the council had a professional company carry out a survey of the condition of the green and it was recommended back then that a permanent watering system should be installed - it will have taken 30 years but we will have done it ourselves!
