Message from Bowls England

'Stay home, stay safe, stop the spread'.

That's the message from Bowls England to its members and clubs in response to the latest Government guidance on the Coronavirus outbreak.

Bowls England last week announced the cancellation of all its domestic events ahead of the 2020 lawn bowls season including its National Championships, and now wishes to ensure that members and clubs play their part.

Tony Allcock OBE, Bowls England Chief Executive, said: "Understandably Bowls England has been inundated with enquiries from clubs and county associations regarding the Coronavirus outbreak. Within the past week we have made decisions regarding our events that would have been unimaginable only a month ago. However, from the enquiries we continue to receive there is clearly still some confusion within our membership as to whether they can continue to participate in the sport of lawn bowls at club level during this period.

"At this stage, we must urge our members to follow the Government's latest guidance, which clearly asks every person within society to stay at home if at all possible to help to stop this disease from spreading – and this is an appeal to everyone, not just those aged over 70 or the 1.5 million of the most at-risk people who have been told that they should stay at home for 12 weeks.

"Again, we encourage our members to keep an eye out for everyone within the bowls community during this time, for example by maintaining contact and undertaking shopping for those who are isolated, with special thought for those members who may live on their own. A telephone call, e-mail or Skype to another member of the bowls community will, I am sure, be welcomed at this time. We are also in the process of producing a 'Bowlers' Workout' in order to keep members fit and active during isolation and/or working from home, so we're all ready to play when bowling resumes. We would also encourage members to support their club financially by continuing to pay their annual subscriptions in order that the clubs will be there for them when we are able to resume bowling."

Bowls England will be providing support and advice to clubs and county associations over the coming weeks and working on a number of initiatives including club recruitment and a potential 'Festival of Bowls', which will be subject to Government guidance.

Some really good news

In spite of all the gloom surrounding the Covid 19 virus Malvern Priory Bowling Club has something to shout about. We now have the automatic irrigation system the club has longed for ever since a report carried out for the Council in the 1980s.

It has taken all these years and a great deal of time and effort to achieve it.

Unfortunately due to the current lockdown the final setting up and commissioning will not be able to take place until we are given the go ahead by the government to resume.

There was much input from members of the club analysing what was the best and cost effective system we could afford. A decision was made, after reviewing all the tenders and specifications, to purchase a kit from a specialised Bowls club contractor who had fitted over 40+ systems. This fitted the budget available. A contract was placed and the kit was supplied on 20th February. The plan had been for me to be there but due to weather conditions we had to stay on our cruise an extra day. I would like to thank all those who attended meetings with me for all their contributions and hard work. I really do appreciate this and I apologise if I may have upset some with the decision that I had to make.

A builder, recommended by a member of the club, was selected to do the work - Simon Bumphrey of SAB Contractors.

Simon started excavating the ditch on Monday 23rd February and it became apparent that he was converse with fitting the piping and stations so he was asked to complete the entire installation. Part of the main contract was for him to straighten the ditch sides and reinforce them. This has been done.

The original plan had been to cap the top of the ditch with paving stones but this proved to be not safe as there was a complete mismatch with the existing uneven paving. The old artificial grass has been put back.

The only thing I did not cater for was the huge amount of spoil we are now left with. This has occurred as the aggregate and sand put behind the ditch wall was needed to make a solid surface to walk on. This spoil now needs to be moved but the cost of a contractor coming into do it is prohibitive at the moment. The amount we have is too great to be lost in the grounds.

The system has been run but needs to be refined.

Again I would like to thank everyone for their cooperation and patience.

More good news

The club has purchased a brand new scarifyer/varicut machine which will enable the green to be maintained.

All fluid fertiliser and weed and feed, wetting agents have also been purchased plus a quantity of top dressing. This is all stored in the shed which will be out of bounds to club members to comply with Health and Safety regulations.

This is all a cost effective exercise having paid our previous contractor huge amounts of money each season.

Until restrictions are lifted by the government the green will be maintained to a standard that will not be good enough for bowling. However, the plan is to be able to open it up as soon as these restrictions are lifted.

Once the restrictions are lifted I will need a band of volunteers to clean, sweep and put back cleaned artificial grass in the bottom of the ditch. I may even be able to talk Jackie into making us lunch!
